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# 1. AIMS AND BACKGROUND

Lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender histories have been commonly regarded as 'hidden' histories. Evidence has all too often been actively suppressed or destroyed, leading to false ideas that these histories do not exist, or that queer sexuality and its impact on society is limited to the present and the very recent past. Even while this is acknowledged to be false by many individuals and institutions, there is still a dearth of *identified* historical material that sheds light on the place of queer<sup>1</sup> sexuality in the story of Victoria, leaving an imbalanced and inaccurate picture of the state's past.

Yet Victoria has a very rich and diverse history in relation to lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender experience. Part of this diversity and richness has been documented by the archival and public work of the Australian Lesbian and Gay Archives since its establishment in 1978. Other organisations, such as the Women's Liberation and Lesbian Feminist Archives, the New Frontier Dance Association and individuals, have also been documenting information and collecting the material culture of queer communities. All, however, face significant challenges in both resources and broader public support and recognition. The Australian Lesbian and Gay Archives, for instance, is a self-funded community group reliant upon volunteers. Its efforts to collect and preserve material and make it accessible to the public has been significantly limited by lack of resources, and, proactive research and accumulation has proved challenging. Conversely, major public collecting institutions such as Museum Victoria and the State Library of Victoria are yet to either focus on queer histories in their collections or adequately recognize and organize relevant material within their collections.

This pilot survey was undertaken to show that with some targeted resource provision for research, we can unearth important and exciting documentation of an important and hitherto 'hidden' aspect of Victoria's, and indeed Australia's, past.

The broad aims of the project include improved knowledge, representation and interpretation of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender material in public collections. It aimed to promote the development of strategies for encouraging discussion and awareness of homosexuality in the mainstream community. It also aimed to begin to provide lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender Victorians with a sense of inclusion in the broader story of our heritage. The survey has provided an opportunity for the celebration of political and social achievements, and recognition of the tenets of equal opportunity and human rights for all Victorians.

The Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender Material Survey has been of both symbolic and practical significance to major Victorian collecting institutions and to GLBT communities in Victoria. It has demonstrated the importance of active collecting, documentation and research into histories which have been and largely remain hidden, and has shown the value of material which exists in both public and private collections.

It has identified areas in which resources are urgently required to document and maintain the material record of GLBT communities in Victoria, provided the groundwork for a broader, nation-wide survey and suggested a range of strategies for improving representation of cultural diversity in our major collecting institutions.

# 1.1 Project background

### 1.1.1 Formulation

In 2003 Museum Victoria was approached by members of the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender communities with a proposal to develop an exhibition to mark the 25<sup>th</sup>

anniversary of the *Crimes (Sexual Offences) Act* 1980, which decriminalised certain sexual acts between men in the state of Victoria. These discussions coincided with moves by Museum Victoria to address issues of cultural diversity in relation to sexuality. Several meetings were held with community representatives and representatives from the State Library of Victoria and the Australian Lesbian and Gay Archives.

Although resources were not available to develop an exhibition for 2005, it was agreed that a survey of collections relating to queer history should be undertaken. It was acknowledged that poor documentation and knowledge of material objects associated with queer histories limited the possibility of future exhibitions, and also limited the possibility of other means of representation of queer cultures in major cultural institutions. It was also acknowledged that the Australian Lesbian and Gay Archives had gathered a substantial collection which was poorly resourced, and that many records of community organisations, personal papers and artefacts were held only in private collections.

It was agreed that the survey was a necessary starting point in representing gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender histories in major institutions. Museum Victoria and the State Library of Victoria agreed to provide funding in 2005 to enable a survey to be undertaken of items in both public institutions and private collections.

### 1.1.2 Brief

The survey research was made up of two major components: investigations into the holdings of public institutions and repositories, and a search for as yet undocumented personal and community collections. A greater emphasis was placed on finding these personal and community-held collections – those of individuals and small groups (eg. political, theatre, social). They are in many ways the hardest to find, making them a priority for research resources.

### Collections identified were:

- Museum Victoria
- Australian Lesbian and Gay Archives
- State Library of Victoria
- National Archives of Australia
- ScreenSound Australia
- National Library of Australia
- Local government collections
- Material held by community groups

### 1.1.3 Audiences

### The lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender communities

An integral part of conducting this research is to address the absence of these communities in Victoria's collective history and to demonstrate to these communities the real commitment held by two of the largest public collecting institutions to recognise their histories as important. It is also to encourage these communities and individuals to recognise the importance of both individual and group collections (initiating, maintaining and promoting them), and the relevance of these resources for research within our communities.

### Museum Victoria and the State Library of Victoria

The absence of these histories and experiences has been due in part to the disinclination of large collecting institutions in the past to take up aspects of cultural diversity that extend beyond a normative definition based on ethnicity. More recently this has begun to shift, with more attention being shown to material relating to these histories. Yet more research is required in this area to unearth material that in likelihood does exist but has not been identified as such. The research outcomes of this project are therefore also aimed at promoting a culture of change within these institutions, to encourage a more concrete engagement with these broader, but vital, definitions of cultural diversity and social life.

### Other historical organisations and collecting bodies

This project provides an example for smaller historical and collecting organisations other than those few that are primarily focused in this field, such as local libraries, regional museums, and community archives, by identifying the importance and richness of this aspect of Victorian history, by drawing out local relevance and by dispelling myths that sexual histories are only relevant within certain milieux in urban centres. These smaller organisations are an important factor in the growth of awareness of the histories of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender communities, and are also vital because of their often close connection with local communities, and 'grass roots' historical practices that resonate strongly with these hidden histories.

### The Victorian public

The general population of the state of Victoria, and indeed the wider Australian public, is probably the most important long-term audience for this project. Through encouraging public institutions, government and other bodies to take up the recommendations raised in this report, the project seeks to influence public knowledge and awareness of the diverse histories of Victoria. These histories are part of the Victorian experience, and the impact of experiences of sexuality applies to all Victorians, not only its sub-communities.

### 2. CONTEXT

# 2.1 Addressing cultural diversity

A significant contribution of this project is to explore and extend the practice of collecting the material record of cultural diversity by public institutions. This includes both the ways in which 'cultural diversity' is defined and how it informs research, collecting and exhibition policies.

### 2.1.1 Definitions of cultural diversity

Deborah Tout-Smith, Curator for Cultural Diversity at Museum Victoria, notes that 'cultural diversity collections in major institutions in Australia still focus on ethnicity, race and nationality rather than the broader meanings of cultural diversity.' Similarly, definitions have commonly remained vague and generalised, and Equal Opportunity statements have often defined practices around cultural diversity as 'acknowledg[ing] the existence of broad cultural groupings." Yet this leaves it open to interpretation how 'cultural groupings' might be conceptualised or included.

Overwhelmingly, interpretations of the meaning of 'cultural diversity' have excluded sexuality and gender as important factors in cultural diversity, yet it is undeniable that there are recognisable cultural groupings around sexual identities and practices both in the present and in Victoria's past. However, this has started to change. The Equal Opportunity Act 1995, useful as measuring tool for definitions of cultural diversity, now clearly includes the categories of gender identity, lawful sexual activity, sex, and sexual orientation in the grounds for equality of opportunity.

Museums Australia's Gay and Lesbian Policy Guidelines argue that:

Islexuality, along with many other factors, is an element of cultural diversity. The mission statements written into museum charters which quarantee the representation of cultural diversity in the collections, education programs and displays of the museum cannot be met successfully until lesbian and gay cultures and histories are included and integrated.4

This survey seeks to promote the expansion of definitions of 'cultural diversity' in thinking about Victoria's past to include not only ethnicity, race and nationality, but also other factors of

identity which give rise to a wide range of cultural practices and expressions, and sexuality in particular. Importantly, it also seeks to recognise the enormous diversity that exists within the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender communities and between histories of sexuality. Histories of queer sexualities are too often reduced to 'lesbian and gay' histories and narratives, which is why this survey set out explicitly to incorporate histories relating to bisexual and transgender experience.

Some clear points of diversity in histories of queer sexuality include experiences of gender, ethnicity, age, religion, geography and location (eg. urban or rural), and different periods within Victoria's history. For example, the experience of two white European women, squatters and partners, on the Bellarine Peninsula in the 1840s (Anne Drysdale and Caroline Newcombe) tells an entirely different story of sexuality than the experience of members of the Jewish men's group ALEPH in Melbourne during the 1990s. The papers of contemporary Melbourne-based author Denis Altman provides a very different insight compared to the archive of audio-recordings of the 'Dykes On Mics' radio program on 3CR between 1995 and 2005.

### 2.1.2 Collecting policies of large organisations

### **Museum Victoria**

The History and Technology Collection at Museum Victoria has, since the late 1980s, been actively collecting material relating to cultural diversity. However, this material has almost entirely been collected in the context of immigration rather than the broader context of cultural diversity, including sexual orientation. In 2004 a new Collection Development Plan (Cultural Diversity) provided the first inclusive definition of cultural diversity and included sexuality as an important feature.

The stated aims of the Cultural Diversity collection include encouraging greater awareness and understanding of the histories and heritage of Victoria's diverse communities, and serious consideration of cultural diversity across collection areas; responding to the needs of culturally specific individuals and communities; and supporting the collection of material that will balance the material record of Victorian history. Furthermore, 'It is recognized that much collecting in this area needs to be proactive to ensure the experiences of minorities or minority experiences are properly documented in the collection.'6

The Plan identifies that 'virtually no material has been collected in [sexuality and gender].' Since the Plan was drafted this shortcoming has been addressed through the inception of the current project. There are now more than 30 objects in the Museum Victoria collection database identified as relevant to the aims of this survey. The vast majority of these were already in the Museum's collection but this relationship to this aspect of history had not previously been identified or acknowledged.

### State Library of Victoria (State Library )

The State Library's Collection Development Policy, underpinned by its Mission Statement, states that:

The State Library of Victoria will enrich the cultural, educational, social and economic life of *all Victorians* by

- collecting, preserving and making available their documentary and published heritage
- promoting the culture and heritage of the State.

A definition of what constitutes the 'cultural, educational, social and economic life' of Victorians is not elaborated, leaving room for normative (ie. *hetero*normative) interpretations of collecting priorities.

The collection processes and categories in the State Library are somewhat different to those of the Museum. Collections of material other than published books are categorised by medium (eg. manuscripts or photographs) rather than social or technological association, and items within the overall State Library collection are catalogued using Library of Congress subject headings. The State Library (and other libraries) uses a selection of subjects from the extensive range of Library of Congress subjects, and that selection is dependent on the range of social and administrative circumstances at the time of selection. In turn, the application of that selection to the material being catalogued can be dependent on the knowledge and personal biases of the cataloguer. As a result, searches of State Library subject catalogues with terms relevant to this project (lesbian, gay, etc.) can return meagre results, and there are significant gaps and silences where the *actual* identification of the experience of queer sexuality is concerned.

In fact, there are currently several overall collections that potentially contain material that is relevant to the aims of this survey, including the Australian Manuscripts Collection, the Oral History Collection, and the Picture Collection. A sample of smaller specific collections within these categories was documented in the survey spreadsheet, such as the Riley and Ephemera Collection, and some of the contents of the Theatre Programmes Collection.

Further resources are needed to do sustained research into the State Library's collection and identify collections of interest to lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender histories.<sup>9</sup>

Significantly, in relation to the Manuscripts Collection, the State Library Collection Development Plan states that a consideration in the acquisition of new material is 'whether the acquisition will build usefully on an existing strength or address an existing weakness'. Directing resources to such research could be seen as beginning to address these gaps.

### 2.1.3 Public institutions and community collections

As a partial explanation of gaps and silences, it should be noted that at times large institutions have been hesitant to actively acquire material relevant to specific groups and subcultures through desire not to 'step on the toes' of smaller, community-based collecting bodies. Where queer histories are concerned, the Australian Lesbian and Gay Archives (ALGA) is an obvious example. While this represents an acknowledgement of the important work of these groups, it cannot be assumed that smaller organisations always have adequate resources, nor that the reasons behind the low level of acquisitions in the area will always be due to such understanding.

Similarly, it is not simply acquisitions and collecting policies and practices that produce gaps in the representation of the heritage of *all Victorians*. A primary reason for the establishment of this broad survey was the absence of *identified* material relating to sexuality within these large institutions. As this survey has shown, relevant material can be found in *existing* collections with appropriate resourcing.

Therefore this project seeks not only to expand definitions of cultural diversity, but promote follow-through in collecting and exhibition practice, and promote an internal culture of change that sees resources directed at identification of relevance in existing collections. It also acknowledges the enormous amount of work that has already been done by small organisations like ALGA.

# 2.2 Historical and national context of the project

There has not previously been any systematic funded research into documenting the material culture of sexuality in Victoria's past, nor anywhere else in Australia.

### 2.2.1 Research

Nationally, the only available example of previous work done in compiling a similar listing of relevant materials is that of the State Library of NSW: a page on their website listing the 'Gay and Lesbian Life and Culture Collection'. The list, which contains examples from across the

library's collections, came out of the internal project, 'Documenting life in NSW'. Gay and lesbian life and culture was one of 35 priority areas within the library's collection identified as needing resources and promotion. 10

A smaller scale, local example of a listing of holdings is found in a 'Queer' directory compiled by the Rowden White Library in the University of Melbourne Student Union, a 'comprehensive list of works by gueer writers or featuring gueer characters.'1

The Australian Lesbian and Gay Archives website contains a wider list of other archival resources, both within and extensively outside Australia. However the Australian list is limited to five repositories: the Darling House Community Library in Adelaide, the EROS Foundation Archive, the Victorian Women's Liberation and Lesbian Feminist Archive, GALAWA (Gay and Lesbian Archive of West Australia), and the AIDS Action Council in the ACT Library. 12 This reveals the importance of this survey in building on work already begun by ALGA.

### 2.2.2 Exhibitions

Between 1982 and 2005, at least 25 exhibitions representing gueer histories have been held around Australia, including six in Victoria. A list of these exhibitions is provided in Appendix 7.7.1. Four of these have been community-organised and curated, and the other two have been components of broader exhibitions at the Australian Jewish Museum.

Nationally, however, many of these exhibitions have drawn out different experiences and challenges. Brief consideration of three examples can illuminate:

### The Gay Museum Exhibition, Western Australian Museum, Perth 2003

'An exhibition exploring the history of lesbian and gay presence in Western Australia', this was primarily a conceptual project. The objects included in the exhibition were often chosen for their ability to provide a 'queer reading' rather than their direct, proven linkage to actual queer experiences or people. As curator Jo Darbyshire explained, 'I appropriated objects from collections of social and maritime history, anthropology and natural science and tried to use them symbolically, ironically and humorously.' One example is a bone dice, recovered from the Zeewijk shipwreck (1727) off the WA coast. Two of the survivors, boys, were later found having sex and were marooned on coral islands. The dice cannot be proven to have had a direct relation to either of the boys, nor does the object itself tell a story about sexuality. Yet it provided an opportunity for interpretation and for the story to be told.

### Circles and Cycles: the Australian Jewish Family, and Under the Covers: Love, Sex and Intimacy in Jewish Life, the Australian Jewish Museum, Melbourne, 1998 and 2002

These two exhibitions contained clear and identified components devoted to incorporate the experience of gay and lesbian people within the Jewish community. According to Museum Director Helen Light, this policy of proactive inclusion is something the Jewish Museum has tried to build into its general exhibition policies. However, they have faced significant challenges. The first of these exhibitions was regarded controversial enough for some school groups to boycott due to the inclusion of lesbian and gay experiences. The second was regarded critically by the Jewish lesbian and gay community as not acknowledging well enough the diversity of sexual experience. Nevertheless, the Director says the Museum is committed to continuing to build upon queer representation.

### Forbidden Love, Bold Passion: An Exhibition of Lesbian Stories, 1900-1990s, touring exhibition, 1995-6

'Forbidden Love' was a travelling exhibition curated by a small community collective, History Inverted, and was built around the narratives of nine women's lives. The material for the exhibition was put together from a variety of sources, mostly arising from the individual research of the curators, and collected from the subjects of the exhibition themselves. It was

displayed at the State Library in Melbourne, as well as at other capital cities and regional centres. It was auspiced by ALGA (ALGA also supplied some of the material), and funded by Visions of Australia, a Federal Government Touring Program. The exhibition was unique for its concentration on lesbians' and women's experiences of sexuality – queer community resources have tended to focus on gay men's experiences. Without government funding it would not have taken place, revealing the importance of resources. But it also shows the advantages of having community direction of exhibition projects in terms of unique emphases that address gaps in the public memory.

### 3. METHODOLOGY

The two most common and interconnected problems with any research work into the histories of the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender communities are the nature and extent of evidence, and knowing how to find it. This survey itself was designed expressly to address the first of these problems. However the second is more complex. Sexuality and sexual identity is in a constant state of movement and change – the sexual and gender identity categories we are familiar with today may or may not have been conceptualised in the same way in the past.

Additionally, determining what material might best illuminate lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender histories is challenging when so much diversity of experience exists within this broad grouping. Often material with less-obvious associations can evoke more insight into experiences of the past. Accordingly, the biggest challenges faced by this survey were in the research parameters and methodology.

In 1992 Garry Wotherspoon observed that in order to unearth lesbian, gay and queer histories in Australia, research requires 'a framework that allows one to look at the history of something which, at that point, did not [officially] exist.' He observed the ongoing methodological problems of finding historical material that went beyond legal records – police, court and prison – that portrayed the history of homosexuality in a condemnatory way. At that time he came up with newspapers, biographies, letters, and oral histories. This project has faced similar obstacles and has worked on expanding this list as much as possible. However this project is aimed at finding and documenting *repositories* of material, both public and private, and not simply isolated historical objects.

### 3.1 Model for research

As this survey was a pilot project, there were no models to follow. It is hoped that this report will provide both a model to be built upon, developed and refined in future work, as well as illuminating some of the challenges faced and lessons drawn.

In the course of the project, a research project in the United Kingdom with similar intentions became known and may prove useful in future where unearthing currently existing contents of large public collecting organisations is concerned. The project was a research survey into the representation of experiences of disability within museums across the UK, the aims of which echoed the aims of the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender Material Survey. The results and methodological structure of the survey were published in the *Museum Management and Curatorship* journal in the article 'Beggars, Freaks and Heroes? Museum Collections and the Hidden History of Disability' (2005). The research report for that survey was entitled *Buried In The Footnotes: The Representation Of Disabled People In Museum And Gallery Collections*.

The research team distributed a detailed questionnaire to 224 curators of different museums/collections to ascertain levels of awareness among curators, details of relevant material and attitudes towards its collection, documentation and interpretation. Of those returned, a shortlist of 10 museums was selected for site visits of one to two days each, where catalogues and databases were searched extensively. The survey revealed a number

of theoretical and practical assumptions, and obstacles and strategies for overcoming them. Evidently, there are significant parallels in the issues facing the documentation and presentation of histories of people with disabilities and those who have identified with or engaged in lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender groups and activity. Importantly, the research began from the assumption that 'there would be evidence to be found'.

Although the brief for this survey was broad – essentially 'casting a wide net' – and was aimed also at discovering and documenting *previously unknown* collections of relevant material, whether in public or private locations, the project model provides a useful framework for searching the existing collections of known public collecting institutions.

More recently, a further research project has begun in the UK which more closely parallels the brief of this project. In their case, the research is with a view to creating an online 'virtual museum' containing information about material from across the UK:

Curators, librarians and archivists across Britain are being asked to scour their collections in search of documents and items relating to the lives of gay people, with a view to establishing a 'virtual museum' of lesbian and gay history. Backed by the museums documentation watchdog, MDA, the group Proud Heritage this week began sending out a two-page survey requesting that institutions throughout the country list the gay and lesbian documents and artefacts in their collections. <sup>16</sup>

It would be beneficial for Australian organisations to watch the progress of that project closely.

# 3.2 Project resources

The project was conducted on a part-time basis over a six-month period, ending in August 2005. It was overseen by the Curator of Cultural Diversity, and was facilitated by an Assistant Curator employed for two days per week. A curatorial assistant was employed for one day per fortnight, and volunteers also provided vital research input to the project. Significantly, a Community Consultative Committee provided regular guidance to the project.

Museum Victoria and the State Library of Victoria each provided funding to support the cost of hiring an Assistant Curator. Museum Victoria also provided in-kind support to the project, including office space and facilities and other resources such as publicity, media and web support. The State Library also assisted with the distribution of information to broader contacts such as the Public Libraries Network.

Significant aspects of the survey research and publicity were carried out on an un-funded basis, demonstrating the importance of the project to the community. Other human resources were provided by volunteers, assistance provided by community organisations and, in some cases, members of the Consultative Committee.

# 3.3 Project methodology

### 3.3.1 Research parameters

The biggest challenge faced by the project was the establishment of research parameters. Given the 'pilot' status of this project, the lack of models to follow, and the research emphasis on casting a wide net, it was challenging to delineate the boundaries of what was relevant and of interest to the aims of the survey, and also to distinguish between types of material.

For example, as can be seen from the survey spreadsheet, many of the collections found were archival in nature rather than 3D object based. These were all accepted as being of potential research relevance, though their potential for use in exhibitions is limited. Similarly, often collections and objects were included for their associations with lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender histories, rather than a direct connection. The Barry Humphreys Collection at the Performing Arts Museum is a good example – while Barry Humphreys himself is not gay, his characters and performance have played a crucial role in popular Australian conceptions of gender and sexuality, and have a level of importance and connection to certain sections of the queer community. A different example is the Percy Grainger Collection of material associated with his interests in sado-masochism. While there is no evidence that he himself

engaged in same-sex acts, the collection was included on the basis of its relevance to non-heteronormative sexuality (though further communication with the curator confirmed that Grainger had homosexual friends, correspondence with whom appears in the collection).

At all times we erred on the side of inclusion rather than exclusion of collections identified, as definitions of what is of interest can shift and change depending on interpretations of what is relevant to lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender experience.

A discussion of this at the Consultative Committee resolved that a multi-tiered research classification system would be an effective way to overcome problems in deciding what sorts of material to prioritise in terms of available resources. The system would use the following classifications as a starting point:

- a) orientation (direct relevance, eg identified individuals, material containing the words lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer or other historically specific terminology such as camp)
- b) association (eg, icons or public figures, individuals associated with lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender communities)
- c) sensibility (symbolism, potential for subtext and queer readings, eg the dice in the WA Gay Museum)

These levels should be seen as overlapping but distinct, primarily providing a research framework.

### 3.3.2 Consultative Committee

A Consultative Committee, established at the outset of the project, provided a significant means of ensuring broad community representation during the project. The Committee incorporated members from the project partner institutions, as well as local government representatives, key community groups and individuals with particular knowledge and experience in this historical field, and representing the spectrum of the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender sexualities. This Committee combined the roles of the community forum and the project committee, and was an invaluable source not only of direction but of information and ideas.

Members who actively participated responded well to the structure, and gave positive feedback on the conduct and purpose of meetings. There were, however, three main hurdles that affected participation, around issues of membership and the frequency of meetings:

- 1. Member identification: The Consultative Committee was kept open and welcomed participation by newer people at each meeting, which was a good approach. However without a clear and meaningful definition of membership and recognition of specific contributions, this posed an obstacle to the active identification by those attending meetings as 'Committee members'. This in turn led to high membership turn-over and affected continuity of discussion. Some discussions were revisited three to four times in order to keep everyone up-to-date.
- 2. Representation: It was observed in the first meeting that there was an imbalance in representation, particularly around gender, and more proactive work was needed in inviting the specific participation of lesbian and transgender community representatives.
- 3. Frequency: There were five meetings in total over the six-month period of the project. The frequency of meetings may have contributed to some of the attendance and membership issues discussed above. The first three meetings were held at two-month intervals, and the remaining two meetings held monthly. The discussions within this monthly period were noticeably more effective in providing direction for the survey and enabled deeper engagement in the work of the project by members.

It is recommended that future projects would benefit from a better-defined membership-based Consultative Committee. This would include: a meaningful definition of membership, both outlining responsibilities and expectations of members but also recognising specific individual

contributions; a comprehensively representative make-up from the beginning; and, depending on the length of the research project, regular and proportionally more frequent meetings.

It is also recommended that future projects of this nature include a public forum in their consultation, participation and publicity strategy. Repeated forums could even be held in varying locations in order to maximise participation. The forum would operate as a mechanism to spark imagination and ideas through presentations of historical stories and material by speakers from both a community and professional perspective. It would also aim to gain the vital participation by older members of the community who hold valuable information in their collective memory.

### 3.3.3 Publicity

As a pilot, this project is a new concept for the wider public. Publicity was a crucial starting point – both for developing interest and momentum in the general community and for promoting the project's ideas and motivations to the queer community. Publicity also helped to promote the pretext of the survey – commemoration of the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the *Crimes* (Sexual Offences) Act 1980, which decriminalised certain sexual acts between men in the state of Victoria.

The majority of publicity work was conducted with the assistance of Museum Victoria's Public Relations Department. A full-colour brochure was designed and printed, and an electronic version was uploaded onto the front page of Museum Victoria's website. The brochure and an introductory letter sought material including:

- Documents, letters, diaries and books
- Photographs, oral histories and films
- Objects symbolizing homosexuality and gender
- Objects evoking experiences of gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender people
- Identity-specific clothing
- Personal mementoes
- Political flyers, posters, stickers and badges
- Political protest clothing

The brochure was distributed as widely as possible at community events and posted to mailing lists. A press release was developed and distributed to all major news outlets and some local papers, and follow-up calls were conducted. Gay and lesbian media were targeted, including B News, Sydney Star Observer, Bule, Lesbians on the Loose, Queensland Pride, Melbourne Community Voice, Pink Pocket Passport, Blaze, QNews, Gay Australia Guide, Out in Perth and Joy FM. Publicity work was continued via media follow-ups throughout the project, with some success.

Community networks were also important in publicizing the project. Information was distributed directly to more than 35 individual community groups and organisations. This included groups in regional Victoria, such as the Country Network, a group that facilitates communication among the older lesbians and gay men across the state. Brochures and information were distributed through the complete mailing lists of ALGA. The ALSO Foundation included information about the survey within their regular newsletter and posted bundles of survey brochures out to member-organisations at their cost. Information was sent electronically to a variety of email lists, including Pride March Victoria and Oz Homo Hist (a national list for discussion of queer history), the Matrix Guild of Victoria and Vintage Men (groups for older women and men respectively). (For a full list of groups contacted, see Appendices.)

The Midsumma Festival 2005 and related events provided a significant avenue for publicity:

- Melbourne City Council exhibition Camp As...Melbourne in the 1950s (13 January to 6 February) – brochures distributed by hand at opening and available for the duration of the exhibition
- Health in Difference Conference (20-22 January) electronic version of brochure projected onto main stage screen and paper copies on information table

- Melbourne Conversations forum 'Secret Life of Us: 50 Glorious Years of Marvellous Melbourne' (3 February) – brochures distributed by hand and project announced from the floor
- Carnival Day (13 February) brochures distributed by hand via the ALGA information stall, and deposited to a majority of other stall-holders
- Victorian Seniors Festival Rainbow Tea Dance (19 March) brochures distributed by hand

Promotion work at these events indicated that the profile of future research would benefit from official recognition by major community event organisations such as Midsumma, and the Lesbian and Gay Mardi Gras, for inclusion in programs and other material.

Successful coverage included the print media and radio:

- Melbourne Community Voice (MCV)
- Jov FM
- 3CR Community Radio (Sally Goldner from Transgender Victoria arranged an interview with Kate Davison on her 3CR show 'Out of the Pan')
- The Age
- Museum Victoria magazine

There were also unsuccessful attempts made to achieve coverage on mainstream radio. It was suggested in a discussion of the Consultative Committee that ABC radio was worth pursuing, and in particular shows hosted by Julie McCrossin and Fran Kelly. Unfortunately, attempts to follow these up were unsuccessful.

Greater success in media coverage could be achieved through advertisements in publications relating to major community events, including but not limited to Midsumma, Lesbian and Gay Mardi Gras, and Melbourne Queer Film Festival, as well as mainstream media. Further assistance could be sought from private collection owners – in particular making inviting them to be available for interviews for 'human interest' stories.

### 3.3.4 Consent forms

The documentation of private collections posed a number of issues, due to restrictions on the use of personal material under the Privacy Act. Private collections, whether individually or collectively owned, cannot be documented without the *consent* of the owner/s. Nor can any personal information be made public without consent. The nature of the subject matter of the survey also posed unique challenges, since sexual orientation is often regarded as an exceptionally sensitive area. These issues had significant implications for our ability to publish the results of the survey.

Consequently a legal consent form was drafted with assistance from the Museum Victoria legal team (see Appendix 7.2). The form allowed for varying levels of internal and public identification, and provided the option for the informant to use a pseudonym. A list of collection owners and representatives to whom consent forms were sent was maintained. Where multiple collections were owned by one person a fresh consent form was signed for each collection, as identification preferences sometimes differed between individual and group collections.

The consent form posed several difficulties in the course of the project. The principal difficulty was that the form was being developed at the same time that collections were being documented, leading to delays in the consent process. Obtaining completed and signed consent forms from all participants with privately-held collections proved cumbersome in some instances, mainly due to postage delays. The survey would have benefited from a more accessible consent form, for example in downloadable format from the web, although a handwritten consent form would still be required.

It is recommended that for future projects a comprehensive consent form be developed prior to beginning documentation of privately held collections. It is also recommended that options for greater accessibility and less cumbersome distribution be explored for all project documents and paperwork, in particular the use of the web for downloads and other information relating to the documentation of privately-held collections.

### 3.3.5 Collaboration and partnership agreement

From the outset the work of the survey was conceptualised as explicitly collaborative, to be primarily directed by the Australian Lesbian and Gay Archives, the State Library and Museum Victoria. In practice, collaboration materialised first and foremost through the Consultative Committee and through the work done by ALGA in providing the survey with an up-to-date version of its most complete list of holdings.

The drafting of a Partnership Agreement between the three organisations was an important symbolic step in the project methodology by establishing a firm structure for on-going strategic partnerships between the organisations, and spelling out the specific contributions and responsibilities of each. The thrust of the Agreement was focussed upon the following outcomes:

- developing an institutional culture that values knowledge and engagement;
- creating strategic partnerships that enable mutual benefits, and community and institutional collaboration;
- developing a network of interested community members and groups, students and scholars;
- sharing resources and knowledge, including fund-sharing;
- demonstrating and promoting a commitment to real cultural diversity in representations and collections;
- promoting an institutional engagement with community processes, needs and practices:
- recognizing suppressed, ignored or undervalued histories and experiences; and
- developing strategies for educating the public about these histories.

The research of the survey therefore expanded from strictly locating and documenting other collections of relevant material to exploring how Museum Victoria and the State Library could structurally and materially support the ALGA. Part of this involved looking at partnership arrangements between other community organisations and public institutions, and related ethical and practical issues.

### Two useful examples are:

The Victorian Women's Liberation and Lesbian Feminist Archive: housed within the Melbourne University Archives, this repository was established as a community project by a collective committee. Since going into the MU Archives, control and ownership of the collection has remained with the committee, but they receive support in the form of space and appropriate storage, and database support. This could provide a useful model for a future arrangement between ALGA and the State Library or Museum Victoria.

The Lesbian and Gay Archives of New Zealand: housed within the main collection of the National Library of New Zealand in Wellington, following a firebomb attack on the original location. LAGANZ have an agreement with the National Library whereby they receive not only storage and other material support, but also curatorial support via funded National Library staff. However it is with caution that a similar arrangement could be adopted here in Australia, as LAGANZ are now subject to access controls and restrictions as dictated by the National Library, rather than remaining under primarily community control. LAGANZ were approached directly information on their Partnership Agreement with the National Library, and their resource base, which will prove useful in both the considerations by ALGA of their own future, and the considerations of the large institutions in supporting them.

The process of developing the Partnership Agreement was also important in illuminating the importance of formal, official, and publicly recognised commitment by large organisations to resourcing and initiating such research projects in a collaborative framework. This is particularly true for research into lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender, which can fall prey to normative interpretations of cultural diversity. In a similar vein, it can potentially be deprioritised without an active and committed curator or staff member. This has been the case at the Mitchell Library in NSW where the Lesbian and Gay Life and Culture collection has not significantly expanded since the departure of a particularly enthusiastic staff member, and is a danger faced by the *LAGANZ* which relies upon curatorial staff volunteering to take on the

responsibility of that collection. A more solidified management-level commitment can guard against the turnover of individual curators and staff.

### 3.3.6 Community contact and liaison

Community contact and liaison formed an extensive and key component of the project methodology, on a general and direct level with both the overall lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender community and with the historical community.

Effective community liaison was of paramount importance; however, the limitations on available resources for thorough follow-up imposed a limitation on its potential. For example, it was suggested within the Consultative Committee that community groups that had been sent information about the survey should be followed up with the offer of staff on the project to attend and address face-to-face meetings of the groups (for example social, political, sporting). However, this would have required a significant increase in staff resources, and was found not to be the most efficient use of the resources available in this pilot project. Direct contact could, however, be explored in future projects, and has been demonstrated to be effective in the UK disability survey.

In practice, community contact and liaison during the project can be divided into the following categories and sub-categories (some of the groups and individuals here were contacted systematically - proactively, and others as a result of information received during research-reactively):

### Individuals

- Owners of individual or group collections (see privately held section of the survey spreadsheet in appendices)

  - Mitchell Library of New South Wales
  - National Library of Australia
  - o Baillieu Library, University of Melbourne (Special Collections)
  - National Library of New Zealand
- Museums:

  - o Percy Grainger Museum, University of Melbourne

[Note: The databases/catalogues of Screensound Australia, ACMI, the National Archives of Australia and the Public Records Office of Australia were searched to varying degrees but no direct contact or liaison took place with staff, hence their omission from this list.]

### 3.3.7 Emphasis of research work

**Public Collections:** The research strategy for public collections primarily consisted of catalogue and database searches of publicly and electronically accessible collections carried out by project staff and volunteers. In some cases information and assistance was provided by librarians, archivists and museum curators.

Catalogue and database searches used a variety of keywords; however, it was evident that successful searching often rested upon one 'knowing what you're looking for before you start looking'. This was particularly true in the case of the State and National Libraries' Manuscripts Collections, and the Public Records Office, where names and biographical information were usually required. Some keywords used included:

Homosexual/ity lesbian/ism gay transgender transsexual bisexual queer intersex spinster pervert/ersion same-sex suffragette impersonation lovers unmarried friendship sexuality women companions sexual health deviance eccentric drag queen/king sapphist variety acts moral/s/ism/ity sex education

These keywords were not all used exhaustively within all public organisations – their application was uneven and at the discretion of individual project staff member or volunteer. The achievement of successful results using various terms was, naturally, also uneven.

It would be beneficial for future projects to develop a thorough list of possible search terms to apply consistently to all collections searched, where possible, thus allowing for more effective comparison. The list contained within this report could be used as a basis for development.

Internal research within Museum Victoria focused on an electronic search of the database using keywords and, importantly, a manual survey of objects in on-site storage. A manual search was felt to be necessary as descriptions of objects in the electronic database are often limited, and the relevance of objects to the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender communities may not be identified in the electronic record. Unfortunately, there were not enough staff and volunteer resources to conduct a thorough survey of the Museum's holdings incorporating off-site storage – such an expansion of the manual survey could return positive results in terms of unearthing already existing material – and only a sample survey was conducted in the History and Technology store at Melbourne Museum – although assessment of collections held in that store by a volunteer has continued after the formal conclusion of this project.

A side aspect of the Museum's internal research and survey strategy was increasing the number of acquisitions of materials and collections related to the project's aims, which complemented the decision of community groups and individuals who wished to donate materials to the Museum.

It is recommended that Museum Victoria, the State Library of Victoria and other collecting institutions continue to document their collections and enhance data relating to their collections to reveal the full relevance of these collections to the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender communities. Standard subject headings both within individual museums and across the museum sector (perhaps auspiced by Museums Australia) would be of particular value in this process. Publicly-accessible, online list of materials and documents of relevance to lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender histories (in the manner of the Mitchell Library of NSW) should be developed.

**Private collections:** Emphasis was overwhelmingly placed upon finding privately-held and individual collections. A significant proportion of time was spent on generating publicity, distributing information among community networks and follow-up work with individuals

regarding potential collections. Follow-up work involved determining the content and relevance of individuals' collections, pursuing useful leads on other privately-held collections, and in some cases making site visits to look at collections and assist in their documentation and description. This process occasionally resulted in commencing an acquisitions process with particular collections and their donors.

An example of where this more intensive research proved useful is the Pokey's Collection of 1980s drag costumes, now owned by Rose Chong Costumes. An acquisitions proposal process has now been commenced after two site visits, an interview with the owner and the photographing of some of the costumes. Research also led to the location of former Pokey's Bar performers who wore the costumes and are now participants of the survey, and also provided leads to other collections of importance and relevance to transgender history in Victoria and Australia.

Access for information about preservation was an issue. In those cases where documenting a private collection did not result in commencing an acquisitions process, some owners were keen to access information about the preservation of their materials until such time as they were ready to donate it or sell it. In some cases, such as the above example of Rose Chong Costumes, the owners were contacted just in time before the materials were disposed of as waste or junk. Information about preservation of historical materials, combined with some information about donating or selling materials, was sent out on request during the project. Community knowledge does need to be supplemented by information about the preservation and significance of material culture, such as that available on the *reCollections* web site hosted by AMOL (now the Collections Australia Network).

Other collections: Smaller public collecting bodies were approached both in a general appeal for information and in some cases in a targeted request for information about specific collections. For example, a letter was posted out to all public libraries through the Victorian Public Libraries Network (via the State Library) requesting general information about collections and materials relating to lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender histories, while the Grainger Museum at the University of Melbourne was approached for specific information about its 'Lust Branch' Collection.

Some smaller public libraries were found to have proactive policies with regard to the identification of materials. However, these were generally confined to the identification of published books. For example, the Darebin Library labels queer relevant books with a rainbow sticker on the spine, allowing easy visual identification by library users. Despite being limited to published books, these libraries were approached for information about their collection and cataloguing policies and procedures, with a view to promoting and distributing these. Further work is required in this area.

# 3.4 Challenges for further consideration

Within the approach and methodology of the survey, apart from the components and processes outlined above, there were four other areas of methodological concern that require consideration.

### 3.4.1 Gaining community trust

Through the community contact and liaison work conducted, it was observed by project staff and volunteers that there still exists a level of scepticism among sections of the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender communities towards the idea that larger institutions are becoming committed to unearthing, documenting and representing queer history. Some still harbour concerns that institutional support and initiation of these projects are a flash in the pan. The only mechanism available to allay these concerns is the conduct and seeing-through of projects like this survey.

However, it should be kept in mind that these concerns present an opportunity for these institutions to rise to the challenge of sustained, ongoing and increasing commitment to broadening the scope and practices of cultural diversity. The very fact that these issues are being discussed within the community is a sign that the community realises the importance of these initiatives. A consideration of this should be kept at the forefront in formulating future projects and outcomes.

### 3.4.2 Dealing with homophobia

Overall the experience of staff and volunteers on the project were positive, and we were met with openness and support by a majority of historical organisations, researchers, support teams and individuals with whom we came in contact during the six month timeframe. The majority of responses to this initiative were unequivocally supportive of this pilot project.

However on a few regrettable occasions, homophobic attitudes did impose limitations upon the potential of various aspects of the survey. For example, an instance involving one organisation had a negative material effect on the survey's profile among a target cohort (older Australians) in seeking personal collections. When approached about distributing information to their networks, the response was that the organisation did not feel it would be 'appropriate' to distribute information 'like that' to their clientele.

Fortunately responses like this were incredibly rare, though it would be beneficial for future projects and research to establish a set of guidelines on how to respond to varying attitudes to sexuality, and how to communicate the aims of the survey to effectively counter-balance notions that lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender histories should be seen as controversial. This could involve developing a kit aimed at outlining the motivations and official endorsements behind the projects, and a more thorough description of their aims.

### 3.4.3 Publicity and media

A challenge faced with some of the *mainstream* media work was the perception that lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender issues are marginal issues, and a corresponding lack of broad coverage. In one case this was overcome and successful coverage achieved when we were able to provide the journalist with some actual people who had personal collections, one of whom had material dating from the 1950s (*The Age* – see appendix 7.4.5). It was also through the collaborative efforts of the ALGA in providing visual material to the journalist from their collection. This was a challenge because the consent process for many of the collections we had found at that point had not yet been finalised. Without the personal, 'human' story, however, it would not have made it into the press.

It is therefore recommended that part of the media strategy of future projects involves approaching a shortlist of collection owners about whether they are willing to tell their personal story to the general public via the media.

### 4. OUTCOMES

This section of the report lists the outcomes for the survey as outlined in the project brief, and provides a summary response to each. There may be some repetition of information contained in above sections; however, this section is effectively intended to be a checklist of outcomes achieved.

# 4.1 Summary of survey findings

An overview of collections can be found in the survey spreadsheet. The work undertaken with respect to specific public and private collections identified in the project brief can be summarized as follows:

# Collecting organisation

### Brief summary of work undertaken and findings

Museum Victoria, Cultural Diversity Collection At the beginning of the survey, Museum Victoria's collection database listed only nine objects with 'lesbian and gay' subject relevance. There are now over 97 objects, with an additional 80 objects with broader relevance to sexuality and feminism. Most of these additions arose from a manual survey of the History and Technology Collections Store at the Melbourne Museum. Further research is required to conduct a similar survey of the Moreland Store.

In addition, there are several pending acquisitions proposals, which will further increase the number of objects with 'lesbian and gay' subject relevance.

# Australian Lesbian and Gay Archives

The most complete list of holdings was updated and provided to the survey by ALGA on CD, which has been provided to Museum Victoria. This list includes not only material held at the main site (Claremont St, Sth Yarra) but also other smaller holdings in private homes of ALGA members.

The list was not included in the survey spreadsheet but is included in the appendices. Unfortunately ALGA does not yet have an online catalogue of holdings due to a lack of funds and technology. (Any resolution to this in the near future will be heavily reliant upon support from larger organisations.)

### State Library of Victoria

Searches were conducted of the Manuscripts and Pictures catalogues, and the Arts Collection (including Theatre Programmes). Some manuscript collections were documented, objects (Anne Drysdale's diaries), and some ephemera collections (eg Riley and Ephemera).

More research is required to continue assessment of the Manuscripts Collection in particular. Certain collections were identified as possibly being relevant (eg the papers of John le Gay Brereton); however, not enough conclusive evidence of relevance to include in the survey spreadsheet.

# National Archives of Australia

Preliminary searches conducted of the NAA image database, returning some results. The main online database was searched using a limited number of key terms. Multiple records were found and documented; however, more research is required to look at records that cannot be identified by keyword searches. Also worth noting is that only around 10% of the NAA's overall holdings appear in the online database.

Other records previously known to be relevant through work conducted by historians were documented. Further research required, and possible assistance could be sought from NAA archival staff such as Robert French (based in Sydney).

### ScreenSound Australia

Basic searches of database done using keywords. These yielded strong results, particularly in lesbian and gay films, sound recordings and footage in Australia from the 1950s and 1960s. Search results included in the appendices.

### National Library of Australia

Preliminary searches conducted of Manuscripts catalogue, but only a handful of Victorian-relevant collections were actually documented – similar to the State Library of Victoria, this requires further research.

Extensive searches were conducted of the Picture Australia database using keywords. Yielded some good results, though search was non-exhaustive. Similar requirements to the Manuscripts collection for further research.

Discussions also took place with Margy Burn (Assistant Director-General, Australian Collections & Reader Services) formerly of Mitchell Library NSW, who expressed interest in promoting the development of greater identification of material. An important area for follow-up in future projects.

# Local government collections

Letters inviting participation in the survey were sent to all Victorian public libraries, many of which are connected to local government councils, but with a poor response. More resources are required to both follow up, and to survey other local government collections. Some local historical societies were contacted (St Kilda, Fitzroy and Collingwood). No results were yielded in the course of the project.

Formal support for the survey was registered by the City of Port Phillip Council; however, this did not automatically translate into the discovery of collections in that particular local council.

### Material held by community groups and personal collections

Introductory letters and brochures, in addition to individual phone calls, emails and face-to-face, yielded strong results in the location and documentation of community and individual collections. 35 privately held collections were documented with consent. Special emphasis was placed on trying to reach the sections of the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender communities that are aged 60 and over.

More collections were discovered, but are still going through the information

gathering and consent process. Several leads remain to be followed up, due to the time and resource constraints of the survey.

Others

Australian War Memorial and Public Records Office of Victoria: very preliminary searches were also conducted of the online catalogues with basic results. These organisations were not officially in the project brief; however, it would be beneficial to incorporate them in future projects.

The Victoria Police Historical Unit: a short visit yielded some promising preliminary findings of stories and material, but more targeted resources and research could unearth strong results. Further research in this collection could also assist in PROV searches.

Registry of Australian Archives and Manuscripts and Royal Historical Society of Victoria online databases were searched extensively using keywords. This turned up some results which were documented in the survey spreadsheet, though there were several records that would require further research into their relevance level.

Melbourne University Archives and Special Collections preliminary searches turned up one particularly important result – the Willis Collection of gay and lesbian subject-relevant books, collected since the 1940s. Contains several rare titles, and as a collection in itself tells a story. Contact was also made with the owner, and possibilities for an oral history interview could be explored. One or two other collections were documented, including the papers of Laurence Collinson (founder of the first Homosexual Law Reform Society).

Of those collections surveyed, the Australian Lesbian and Gay Archives stood out in terms of the urgent need to document its rich collection. It is recommended that ALGA work towards establishing an online catalogue of archive objects, with the support of Museum Victoria and the State Library of Victoria.

### 4.2 Assessment of absences in the material record

The most obvious absences include material pre-dating the 1970s, transgender, bisexual and lesbian histories, and regional Victoria:

- Material documenting life prior to the 1970s and 1980s. A vast majority of privately held collections contained material limited to the last ten to twenty years. Only around 5 out of 35 privately held collections predated 1980, and only a further 2 collections predated the year 1970 (these were the Keith Stodden Collection, 1960s onwards, and the 'Life and Times of a Gay Man' Kendall Lovett Collection, 1922 onwards)
- Transgender, bisexual and to a lesser extent lesbian histories. As a result of this, extensive work was done in to finding material documentation of transgender and drag histories in Victoria, however these three sections of the community are still overwhelmingly underrepresented in the material record.
- Regional Victoria. While regional networks and community groups were targeted in the promotional and advertising stage of the survey, few results were achieved. Where there were leads on potential information and collections, these were prioritised (for example a lead that was given on an old hotel in Ballarat – unfortunately with no concrete results); however, it would be beneficial to have more resources available to conduct detailed surveys of libraries in larger regional centres (eg Ballarat, Bendigo, Traralgon, Shepparton, Wodonga).

Aside from these, it is worth noting the *silences* (as opposed to absences) in the material record which were overwhelmingly found in nineteenth and early twentieth century material held in the larger collecting institutions. However, the major silence is evident in the lack of representation of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender histories in existing exhibitions.

Part of this project has been aimed at promoting a culture of change within exhibiting organisations in terms of encouraging representations of how queer sexuality has contributed to and enriched the experiences of people in other aspects of life – in stories of immigration, in the life of Melbourne, within Indigenous Australian histories, and in relation to scientific, biological and technological areas. A notable example of a silence in relation to queer experience and identity within the Museum is the Mind and Body Gallery, Melbourne, where an exclusively hetero-normative, reproduction-focused story of sexuality is told.

### 4.3 Key issues

The survey has highlighted the need for urgent action to support the preservation and identification of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender material culture. The following key issues were raised in the course of the project:

### 4.3.1 On-going documentation

The documentation of material in major collections relating to lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender experience has been confirmed as a major area of concern by this project. It is recommended that that Museum Victoria, the State Library of Victoria and other collecting institutions, large and small, continue to document their collections and enhance data relating to their collections to reveal the full relevance of these collections to the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender communities. Standard subject headings both within individual museums and across the museum sector (perhaps auspiced by Museums Australia) would be of particular value in this process. As part of this process, it is recommended that major collecting institutions develop publicly accessible, online lists of materials and documents within its collection of relevance to lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender histories (in the manner of the Mitchell Library of NSW).

### 4.3.2 Physical storage needs

Another key issue relates to the immediate physical storage of those collections known to exist outside major institutions. Of particular note are the Australian Lesbian and Gay Archives, currently lacking storage space and partially held in private homes. Urgent measures are required to ensure the survival of this important collection. It is recommended that major collecting institutions such as the State Library of Victoria and Museum Victoria consider how they might offer practical support and assist in the development of a long-term solution to this largely paper-based collection.

### 4.3.3 ALGA collection database

The Australian Lesbian and Gay Archives holds perhaps the most significant collection of material relating to lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender history in Australia. Support is urgently required to establish an online catalogue of the collection. Major collecting institutions could provide practical support.

### 4.3.4 Private collections and the loss of community knowledge

The importance and urgency of identifying and supporting or collecting personal and private collections of individuals over the age of 60 was identified in the course of the survey. Many older, pre-1970s records are disappearing as their owners and collectors age and pass away. More contact is required between collecting institutions and networks of older lesbians, gay men, bisexual and transgender men and women; appeals also need to be made to family members and descendants to provide information about collections that might be of relevance. A greater inclusion in official publicity of large collecting institutions would assist greatly with this process.

### 4.3.5 Representation in exhibitions and other public programs

A significant recommendation of this report relates to the goal of mounting a large museum-quality exhibition of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender histories from Victoria and from around Australia. As the project brief was being developed, it was envisaged that the outcomes would bring us closer to a professionally-developed historical exhibition of material relating to queer sexuality hosted by a major collecting institution. The exhibition could incorporate collaboration with partner-museums and libraries in other states and territories. It is worth noting that a museum-coordinated, large scale exhibition of this historical material would break new ground in Australia, and would occupy a leading position internationally.

Such an exhibition would be a highly effective way of raising awareness of the need for these histories to continue to be unearthed and documented, and would therefore contribute to the primary aim of this project – to build into the Victorian and Australian story the important role that sexuality, sexual experience and identity has played not only in individuals lives but also in broader society. It is acknowledged that this recommendation carries significant funding implications. Without a future commitment of large scale funding for such an endeavour, an exhibition would not be possible.

In the meantime, smaller-scale opportunities exist for representing lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender histories, such as the Community Collections program at Museum Victoria. These histories can also be better represented in broader exhibition contexts at both major and minor collecting institutions, such as general histories about Melbourne.

Other public programs such as outreach activities, and web-based technologies, also offer opportunities to improve representation of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender histories. For example, the State Library of Victoria is considering the development of a bibliography on the Library's website, following the model of the State Library of New South Wales' "Gay and lesbian life and culture" web page.

### 4.3.6 National survey

During the course of the project, the Consultative Committee recommended that an Australian Research Council grant be pursued, led by the University of Melbourne and supported by institutions such as Museum Victoria. This grant would fund a more comprehensive, and possibly national, version of this survey. It is evident that much of the source material that is of relevance to Victoria also has aspects of relevance to histories of queer sexuality in a national context. Further to this, many of the repositories containing relevant material do not limit their collections to Victoria. The Australian Lesbian and Gay Archives is but one example.

### 4.3.7 Partnership opportunities

Another primary and significant contribution of this survey is its implications for research partnerships and future work in the area. This is the first time the Australian Lesbian and Gay Archives, the State Library of Victoria and Museum Victoria have joined together on a project to advance the recognition and celebration of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender histories.

The undertaking of this survey has established a structure for on-going strategic partnerships between these collections, allowing major collecting agencies to effectively complement, rather than compete with, collections of organizations such as the Australian Lesbian and Gay Archives.

### 4.3.8 Distribution of information

It is recommended that the public version of this report (which excludes all personal information) be made available on the web sites of the partner institutions, and that its findings and recommendations be used to inform future projects aimed at preserving, acknowledging and embracing lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender history and culture.

# APPENDIX 6.1 Survey of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender collections in Victoria

History & Technology Department, Museum Victoria, September 2004

### Aim

To survey both overtly and covertly lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender material in a broad range of public and private collections in Victoria, to provide a written report and digital list of the material identified, and to make recommendations for further research, partnerships and public programs.

### Introduction

2005 marks the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of a highly significant date in Victorian history: the passing of legislation decriminalizing homosexuality – the Crimes (Sexual Offences) Act 9509, on 23 December 1980. Lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender communities in Victoria are exploring how joining forces could help to celebrate and explore the meaning of this anniversary. A range of inclusive projects are proposed that will present homosexuality as a part of mainstream life, and show that gay and lesbian history is relevant to, and part of, the broader story of human experience.

A key component of this anniversary is a survey of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender material held in public and private collections. The survey will be led by Museum Victoria, in association with the State Library of Victoria, the University of Melbourne and the Australian Lesbian and Gay Archives.

The project will be of considerable symbolic significance, with the foremost museum and library in Victoria joining forces with community organizations and individuals to acknowledge the importance of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender history.

### Focus of project

The project will survey both overtly and covertly lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender material in a broad range of public and private collections in Victoria. It will consider material that is clearly associated with the history of those communities, as well as material records of the social, cultural, political, legal and religious structures and events that have affected lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender people over time.

The project will draw together material held across a broad range of collections. Importantly, it will re-connect objects and information that have been separated by accident or agency into disparate collections. As well, it will build up cohesive stories of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender history and experience that have never before been told.

The project will establish a structure for on-going strategic partnerships between collections, allowing major collecting agencies to effectively complement, rather than compete with, collections of organizations such as the Victorian Lesbian and Gay Archive. Within collecting agencies it will provide a basis for the revision of collection policies and the inception of active collecting programs. It also provide a model for the on-going management of existing and future collections of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender material. It will also provide the basis for a range of interpretative strategies, including research projects, exhibitions, education programs and publications.

Importantly, this will be a pilot project, providing a model for a national survey of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender material for which an Australian Research Council grant may be sought.

The broad aims of the project include improved knowledge, representation and interpretation of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender material in public collections. The project will encourage discussion and awareness of homosexuality in the mainstream community, emphasizing similarities and connections within our society as a whole. It will redress the marginalization of lesbian and gay history, and explore the remaining bastions of social resistance to homosexuality in a reflective, educative manner. Importantly, it will also help to provide lesbian and gay Victorians with a sense of inclusion and community, redressing the isolation and shame some people experience in their journeys to sexual identity. The project provides a significant opportunity for the celebration of political and social achievements, and recognition of the tenets of equal opportunity and human rights for all Victorians.

### **Project components**

- Undertake research of material documenting or relating to the history of the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender communities, including objects, audio-visual material such as photographs and moving footage, documents and other archival material in both public and private collections in Victoria (including institutions identified below)
- Assist the promotion of the project at the Midsumma Festival 2005 and other through lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender community networks
- Conduct a community forum as a means of establishing working relationships and identifying possible locations of material
- Work with the project committee (an internal and external body) to undertake on-going assessment of the direction and scope of the project
- Establish and maintain project files including detailed notes of organizations and communities contacted
- Establish a spreadsheet or database of material identified, and enter information on an on-going basis

### **Project outcomes**

- 1. A comprehensive written report including:
  - An overview of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender material culture held in specific public and private collections in Victoria
  - An assessment of absences in the material record of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender history
  - Identification of key issues for the collection of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender material culture over the next five years
  - Recommendation of longer-term strategies for the documentation of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender histories by collecting institutions that will inform future policy development
- 2. An Excel spreadsheet or database that records specific details on each item of material culture identified, including brief description and catalogue number or other identifier

### Collections

The project will survey lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender material in a range of collections, including:

- Museum Victoria collections: Australian Society and Technology; Indigenous Cultures
- Australian Lesbian and Gay Archives

- State Library of Victoria
- National Archives of Australia
- Screensound Australia

- Material held by community groups
- Personal collections

### Time frame

The project would be undertaken by an assistant curator on either a full-time (three months) or part-time (six months) basis. The appointee will be based at Museum Victoria, or as agreed by parties to the project.

### APPENDIX 2: Material culture context

The project will be based on a range of assumptions about material culture and its relationship to lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender history:

- 1. Lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender history and culture that is concealed or lost can be revealed, re-discovered or re-interpreted.
- 2. Lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender history can and should be represented through material culture.
- 3. Material culture is fundamental to the representation of history.
- 4. Material culture should not be dismissed as a 'straight' way of looking at history.
- 5. The reason why gay and lesbian material culture is scarcely visible may be and or all of:
  - 5.1. Deliberate concealment
  - 5.2. Deliberate destruction
  - 5.3. History of sexuality does not have a strong material record
  - 5.4. Lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender history represents minority history and statistically is therefore less likely to leave material evidence
- 6. The absences in the material record of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender is evidence of historic experience.
- 7. The re-interpretation of historic material is both possible and worthwhile.
- 8. The values and meanings of material culture can be re-assigned.
- 9. Interpretations of material culture by contemporary curators and / or artists can legitimately shed light on historic material.

#### Scienceworks' steam tractor makes triumphant return to Mt Gambier

In March this year the Scienceworks' Cowley Steam Traction Engine returned to the place where it ended its working life with a parade through the streets of Mount Gambier in South Australia. #### Gay and Lesbian materials collection survey

Late last year Museum Victoria in association with the State Library of Victoria, the University of Melbourne and the Australian Lesbian and Gay Archives commenced research into public and private collections of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender material in Victoria.

2005 marks the 25th anniversary of the passing of legislation decriminalizing homosexuality in Victoria by Act of Parliament, ratified in December 1980.

To date the project has surveyed material in a broad range of public and private collections in Victoria. It has targeted material clearly associated with the history of those communities, as well as material records of the social, cultural, political, legal and religious structures and events that have affected these people over time.

So far, much has been uncovered in the way of personal and private collections, including flyers and information of community groups, political events and social occasions, particularly material that has been collected since the 1970s.



The aim of the research is to produce a report and listing of the material identified, and to make recommendations for further research, partnerships and public programs. It is hoped that this research will establish a structure for ongoing strategic partnerships between collections, allowing major collecting agencies to effectively complement, rather than compete with, collections of organisations such as the Victorian Lesbian and Gay Archive.


This year marks the 25th anniversary of Victorian laws decriminalising homosexuality. To commemorate the event,

the Melbourne Museum has begun a pioneering project of its own: a survey of gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender materials in the community.

The museum, which is part-nered by the State Library, is seeking information about artefacts such as letters, diaries, artefacts such as letters, diaries, personal papers, costumes, photographs and props from the public to help reconstruct what has remained a largely hidden history until the emergence of a muscular gay rights movement in the 1970s.

"There's a lot of history that's

'There's a lot of history that's only in people's heads," says Graham Willett, a Melbourne University researcher and author of Living Out Loud: a History of Gay and Lesbian Activism.



Kate Davison, curator of the project, says the archival ambitions are modest for the moment. The museum does not want to acquire the materials, but catalogue them "so we really know what's out there". Eventually, some of the artefacts any, some of the arteriacts — among them an ANZAC com-memorative medal designed by lesbian sculptor Dora Ohlfsen — may be used to mount an exhi-bition.

"Somebody discovered it in a second-hand shop, but we have not been able to trace the person to whom it was sent in country Victoria," says Gary lavnes, a custodian at the gay

and lesbian archive.

Another prized exhibit retained by the archive is the

private papers of the late lesbian centenarian Monty Punshon. She is distinguished for coming

out publicly at the age of 104.

Mr Lovett, who volunteers at the archive once a month, has chosen to keep most of his per-sonal papers and photos at home in the northern suburbs where he lives with his partner Mannie De Saxe, 78. While he has no plans to publish the account, he has written the first draft of his own life, which he has entitled "A Gay Life in

has entitled "A Gay Life in Parts".

Recalling gay Melbourne of the 1950s he writes evocatively of attending one intimate party. "We learned of a very good resturant in South Yarra run by 'two of the fraternity'... my partner and I decided to book a table for 7pm one weekday evening.
