Preface

The following annotated list of editorials in Australian newspapers related to homosexuality was compiled by Graham Carbery for the Australian Lesbian and Gay Archives in June 1992.

The original list had 388 entries, taken from 59 publications, spanning the period from 1949 to the end of 1991.

This revised list has 395 entries from 61 publications. It includes an additional seven entries from ALGA's pre-1970 clippings list: two are from 1913, and others are from 1940, 1946, 1949 and 1954 (two entries).

The bulk of the entries are from metropolitan dailies and regional and suburban newspapers. For the periodicals up to 1980, we are indebted to published research by Robert French and Wayne Murdoch (see references below). ALGA also benefited from access to press clippings services (from 1982 courtesy of *OutRage* magazine) and donations from many individual collectors.

The list excludes editorials from gay and lesbian publications, since the purpose of the project was to provide a research tool for people investigating the representation of, and changing attitudes towards, homosexuality in the non-gay print media in Australia.

At the time of publication, the editorials collection comprised about one percent of the Archives' total collection of newspaper clippings - then about 40,000 clippings, occupying 9 metres of shelving. However the editorials collection is considered a particularly significant indicator of both public attitudes towards homosexuality and the print media's role in forming them.

All entries are held at the Archives, except those denoted with an asterisk (*), which are available through state libraries.

We recognise that this collection is unlikely to be comprehensive, and we welcome information about relevant omissions.

ALGA would be glad to assist anyone wanting to extend the project. Any extension should take in the period 1992 up to about 1996, after which the online indexes of newspaper clippings capture this information more effectively than manual collecting methods.
