

The Australian Queer Archives Oral History Project

You are invited to participate in the Australian Queer Archives Oral History Project. The Australian Queer Archives Inc. (AQuA) is a volunteer, not-for-profit community organisation, established in 1978.

We aim to preserve records by or about lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgendered, intersex and queer people in Australia, past and present, for use by future generations. A vital part of AQuA's work is its oral history project, which records memories and stories for posterity.

We would like to interview you for the oral history project. The duration of the interview is up to you, but it would typically take one to one-and-a-half hours. Follow-up interviews may also be arranged, if mutually convenient.

The interview will be recorded, and the recording will become part of AQuA's collection. To help with documentation and access, we may also make a transcript of the recording, or make a log of key points.

You can choose when you would like the interview and the transcript or log to become available to the public as part of AQuA's oral history collection. You may choose to allow access to the interview immediately, or at a particular date you choose, or after your lifetime. AQuA's collection is used by students, historians, filmmakers, novelists, activists and other researchers. Material from it has been used in articles, books, theses, documentaries and exhibitions.

You can also choose whether you would like your name to be disclosed to the public when the interview becomes available, or whether you would like to remain anonymous. If you do not want your name disclosed, your anonymity will be protected, within the limits of the law.

To allow for use of the interview by researchers once it becomes available to the public, we ask that you assign copyright in the interview to AQuA. This allows AQuA to control publication and copying, always subject to your choices about public access and anonymity.
